

Cargo bikes for all!

2nd conference Cargo Bike Sharing Europe on 24 May in Cologne

The cargo bike boom is also driving the rise of cargo bike sharing systems. On 24 May 2023, the second Cargo Bike Sharing Europe conference takes place in Cologne at the polisMOBILITY trade fair. The role of cities for successful cargo bike sharing systems will be a key focus.

The host city Cologne sets a good example: In December 2022, the first e-cargo bikes were integrated into Cologne's public bike sharing system. In Germany, cargo bike sharing is already available in over 160 cities.

The one-day conference Cargo Bike Sharing Europe brings together pioneering cities, companies and activists and offers a unique overview of concepts and trends. Organized by the Berlin-based agency cargobike.jetzt and the German bicycle industry association Zukunft Fahrrad, partners include the European Cyclists' Federation, Cycling Industries Europe and the Association of Bicycle-Friendly Cities in North Rhine-Westphalia (AGFS).

"Innovative mobility services such as cargo bike sharing are increasingly important for sustainable transport and the cycling industry. Cities have a key role to play and are therefore at the centre of the conference", says **Wasilis von Rauch, Managing Director of Zukunft Fahrrad**.

AGFS chair Christine Fuchs believes that cargo bike sharing is a great tool for cities to advance sustainable mobility: *"User-friendly and affordable systems motivate a broad range of people to use comfortable cargo bikes instead of cars, e.g. for child transport and grocery shopping. The conference offers cities a platform to get into the topic and plan their own cargo bike sharing systems."*

BACKGROUND ON CARGO BIKE SHARING

The [European Cyclists' Federation](#) (ECF) tracker for cargo bike friendly cities analyses 125 European cities. 69 of them have a cargo bike sharing system.

Polls for the German transport ministry show a growing interest in cargo bike sharing. The percentage of Germans who could imagine using cargo bike sharing rose from 21 in 2019 to 28 in 2021 while the share of potential buyers only rose from 10 to 12 percent.

Since 2022, the German state of North Rhine-Westphalia has provided 80 per cent funding for the establishment and operation of municipal bike sharing systems in the first three years.

In December 2022, the City of Cologne integrated the first 15 e-cargo bikes into the municipal bicycle rental system KVB-Rad. Public transport customers can use the bikes for 90 minutes per week free of charge.
